We can also see the determination shown by builders to come up with increasingly ecofriendly solutions for sailing. Hybrid propulsion systems and all that goes with these concepts will be well represented at the next edition. Limiting the impact on the environment remains our priority and that of the entire sector.

We are looking forward to the spring, when we will be able to share our passion for multihulls and the sea at this fourteenth edition. Hoping to see you from 12th April!

# Some facts and figures about the global multihull sector in 2022

As we look forward to the 14th edition, we can see that the enthusiasm of the public for multihulls remains intact and has indeed become even stronger. The two year absence of this event entirely dedicated to multihulls has had no impact on the commitment of exhibitors, partners or the general public. Even more of them turned up and we are delighted to see such enthusiasm. The Show is now a major date on the international sailing calendar that cannot be missed. New boatyards, equipment manufacturers and suppliers have joined this event, which is the most rewarding outcome for us.

# The domestic production

The turnover of France's marine industry was 1.36 Billion €, with the multihull sector experiencing a quite considerable turnover of 523 million €.

This figure takes on even greater significance, when it is compared to the 825 million € for the sailboat market, including both monohulls and multihulls. The 8.4% decline to 800 million € we have observed over the past few years, is down to the Covid effect, so is not that significant.

France remains the world's leading player in the production of catamarans and trimarans, with a market share of 70% for the sailboat sector. Production is divided up between multihulls (64%) and monohulls (36%), reflecting the latest developments and trends, which show a favourable move towards catamarans and trimarans.

Looking at overall production in France of sailboats and motorboats, the market is divided up in the following way:

• Fountaine Pajot: 280 units/year

• Bali/catana: 220 units/year

They are followed by the Outremer, Privilège, Neel, Excess, MarsaudonComposites brands among others. Their overall production comes to around 100150 boats per year.

#### An international market

With no official figures available, global production of multihulls is estimated to be around 1500 units.

- 1200 sailboats (80% of the market)
- 300 motorboats (20% of the market)

Behind France, South Africa is the world's second largest producer - the Robertson & Caine yards produce between 180 and 200 units each year and figure among the world's leading builders.

After them, there are brands with a lower level of production, which add to the diversity of this thriving sector.

We are certainly not lacking projects around the world and the multihull club design area at the heart

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world, is a clear expression of that.

#### Mototboats: a new market

We can note growing enthusiasm for motorised catamarans (around 300 per year) and this is particularly the case for larger boats.

To remind you, here are some of the many arguments in favour of catamarans: ratio of length to volume, stability, lower consumption, Friendly living space, reduced draught, etc.

#### **Charter market**

After coming to a sudden halt for two years due to the pandemic, the charter market is back in business and has regained its previous good health.

Large charter fleets like Dream Yacht Charter, Sunsail, Moorings, Kiriacoulis and Navigare represent 35 to 40% of overall production and sales for boat builders.

Nevertheless, these major charter companies are not the only ones in the market and smaller local charter firms have also fared well with a more personalised approach.

Sales between private individuals have been constantly growing, and the appearance of companies like VogueAvecMoi, Sam Boat and Skippair, to name but a few, is a good example of this trend.

Today, new clients tend to favour chartering boats rather than buying them. The opportunity of choosing from a wide range of sailing areas and the increasing number of bases available has clearly encouraged the move towards charter management.

This helps explain why renewal programmes carried out by charter firms have met with such success.

#### The future

Innovation and ecoresponsibility are also moving forward and the ARCHITECTS, INNOVATION, DESIGN area is a way for start ups to come and show off their products. This area, which is the only one of its kind, continues to act as an incubator for innovative businesses, displaying a wide range of the latest technologies for multihulls.

We are now living in a digital world and boating is no exception to that. It is clearly visible when we look at the progress made in terms of safety, sail technology and composite materials... The next edition of the International Multihull Show will be the best way to discover all that.

Each year, Boats Group carries out a study of the secondhand multihull market. Here is an extract from the 2023 study.

Worldwide, there are 2,425 multihulls listed on YachtWorld as of January 2023, which is 10.9 % more than last year (2,168).

In Europe, this number is 1,670, which is 8.6 % more than last year. On Annonces du Bateau, the leading boat marketplace in France, this number is 286 (17.2 % more than last year).

Across all Boats Group portals in the world, this number is 3,571 (12.8 % more than last year). Across all European Boats Group portals, this number is 2,512 (7.5 % more than last year).

The top 3 brands in Europe by number of multihull sailboats announced and by number of page views as of January 2023 are Lagoon, Fountaine Pajot and Bali.

Over the last 12 months, multihulls were sold faster than the year before, a trend that's been going on since the pandemic:

- Worldwide, on all Boats Group portals, multihulls were sold 9 % faster (32 weeks in 2022 vs 35 weeks in 2021).
- On European BG portals, multihulls were sold 2 % times faster (44 weeks in 2022 vs 45 weeks in 2021).
- In France, multihulls were sold 25 % faster (39 weeks in 2022 vs 52 weeks in 2021).
